Entrance Requirements

Science: 4 semesters of HS science other than physical science, ≥ 27 on ACT science subscore.

Deficiency: 3 hours in field other than HS

Foreign Language: 4 semesters, one language, in HS.

Deficiency: 6 hours in one language.

Entering students with fewer than 64 hours and all students planning to take their first college math course must have appropriate SAT/ ACT/ COMPASS scores for placement.
