THE COURSES

PSYC 490 Special Topics: The Psychology of Ideology

A study of the psychological dynamics involved in the construction of ideological worldviews, with particular focus on the conflicts between worldviews. Case studies will include the Reformation, the Cold War, the Holocaust, and the scientific revolutions of Relativity and Quantum Theory.

PSYC 370 Social Psychology

A study of the processes of intersocial stimulation and their consequences, with a focus on the processes leading to the rise and fall of Nazism and the Holocaust in Germany before World War II, the rise and fall of the Iron Curtain and the Cold War, and the modern unification.

PROGRAM FEATURES

- Meet and share experiences with students and educators in Germany.
- Program excursions in and around Leipzig (field trips, concerts, museums).
- Visit Berlin and Wittenburg and find roots of our spiritual, moral, political and scientific heritage.
- Explore the towns where Luther, Einstein, Bonhoeffer and Marx once lived and worked.
- Service-learning opportunities in Leipzig.

THE COST

Tuition and fees are the same as they are in Abilene. The additional program fee of \$4,900 includes:

- Transportation between DFW and Germany
- Housing
- Two meals a day
- Program-related excursions and enrichment activities
- Basic medical and traveler's insurance

APPLICATION

Acceptance to the ACU Psychology in Germany program is based on a variety of factors including:

- Completed application packet with satisfactory reference forms and \$200 application fee
- Availability of space
- Completion of at least 30 credit hours on campus
- Academic record and interests, a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 as of date of application
- Students must be in good standing with ACU (no probation of any kind) as of date of application.

Note: Consideration also will be given to a student's suitability for participation in an ACU Study Abroad program.
