### Leipzig, Germany

**The City:** During the days of the former East Germany, Leipzig was the second largest city in the East, after Berlin. As the home of Bach, Leipzig has for years been known worldwide as a city of music. Leipzig also played a foundational role in the formation of German 18<sup>th</sup> century philosophy, known as the Age of Enlightenment.

**Dr. Laura Carroll** (Ph.D., Discourse Studies, Texas A&M University) is an Associate Professor in the Language and Literature Department and will be returning for her second semester in Oxford. She specializes in the teaching of writing, rhetoric, and critical theory. Her husband, **Dr. Bill Carroll**, and two daughters are also looking forward to returning to Europe.

### Program Features

- **10-day excursion to Greece** and other planned class-related excursions may include Prague, Berlin, Vienna, Athens, Wittenberg, Zagreb, and Dresden.
- Transportation between Abilene and Leipzig (return to DFW airport).
- International service-learning opportunities and a peer-mentoring program with German students.
- Student housing in furnished apartments includes bedrooms, bathrooms, kitchen, living spaces, and wireless Internet. Linens and a towel are also provided.
- At least one long weekend and a weeklong break for personal travel. Students are also encouraged to speak with our travel agent about extending their trip at the program's conclusion to allow for additional personal travel.
- Medical and travelers' insurance included for the duration of the program.

### Application

Acceptance to the ACU in Germany program is based on a variety of factors including:

- Completed application packet with satisfactory reference forms.
- Availability of space.
- \$250 non-refundable application fee.
- Completion of at least two semesters on campus.
- Academic record and interests, a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 as of date of application and up to date of departure.
- Students must be in good standing with ACU (no probation of any kind) as of date of application and up to date of departure.

**Note: Consideration also will be given to a student's suitability for participation in a study abroad program.**
