He graduated in May 2002 with a Ph.D. in composition/rhetoric from the University of Southern Mississippi, specializing in composition theory, rhetorical history, literacy studies, ethnography, and linguistics.

THE COURSE

ENG 446/540: Modern American Expatriate Writers

All ACU students, particularly English majors and graduate students, are invited to attend ACU in Oxford during Maymester 2007, for 3 hours' credit in upper-level American literature. We will spend one-and-a-half weeks at our campus in Oxford, where we will read and discuss some of America's most famous (and not-so-famous) expatriate authors of the early 20th century. Then we will visit Pamplona and San Sebastian, two cities in the Basque region of Spain visited and written about by Ernest Hemingway.

PROGRAM FEATURES

- Great location in fashionable North Oxford.
- Student housing in two renovated Victorian houses includes dorm rooms, bathrooms, kitchens, computer lab, classroom space, and laundry facilities.
- Planned class related excursions around Oxford and to Pamplona and San Sebastian, Spain.
- Medical and travelers' insurance included.
- Additional option for personal travel at the conclusion of the program.

THE COST

Tuition and fees are the same as they are in Abilene. The additional program fee of \$2,900 includes:

- Transportation between Dallas (DFW) and Oxford.
- Housing in Oxford.

- Program-related field trips and enrichment activities.

APPLICATION

Acceptance to the ACU in Oxford program is based on a variety of factors including:

- Completed application packet with satisfactory reference forms and \$100 application fee.
- Availability of space.
- Completion of at least 30 credit hours on campus.
- Academic record and interests, a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 as of date of application.
- Students must be in good standing with ACU (no probation of any kind) as of date of application.

Note: Consideration will also be given to a student's suitability for participation in an ACU Study Abroad Program.
