Professional Licensing Disclosure for the SLP-Assistant through Abilene Christian University's CSD Undergraduate Degree.

To practice as a Speech-Language Pathology - Assistant [SLP-A] requires a professional license, registration or certification in most states and US territory. Each state/territory has its own standards for practice and regulates SLP "support personnel" differently. Support personnel includes technicians, aides, paraprofessionals, as well as SLP-Assistants. This document provides you a list of states/territories where this institution has made the determination that its communication disorders curriculum either meets the educational requirements for licensure or does not meet the educational requirements for licensure as a Speech-Language Pathology - Assistant.

The degree program provides clinical practicum experiences resulting in 25 hours of supervised observation and 25 hours of supervised clinical hands-on experience. Some states require additional hours of supervised clinical experience which will require enrollment in additional semesters of clinical practicum. The chart below indicates which states require more supervised clinical experience hours than is provided in the degree.

Also, you must understand that in the states/territories where the institution has made the determination that its curriculum meets the educational requirements for licensure, this does not mean that this is the only requirement to be licensed in that state/territory. Every state/territory likely will have additional requirements to be licensed in that state/territory.

To assist you in making your decision whether to apply to ACU's CSD program and complete the optional SLP-A training, we have provided you a list of states and territories and the respective contact information for the state board of examiners in speech-language pathology, where available. We encourage you to contact the licensing/governing body in the state or territory in which you desire to become licensed or intend to work to seek additional information.
