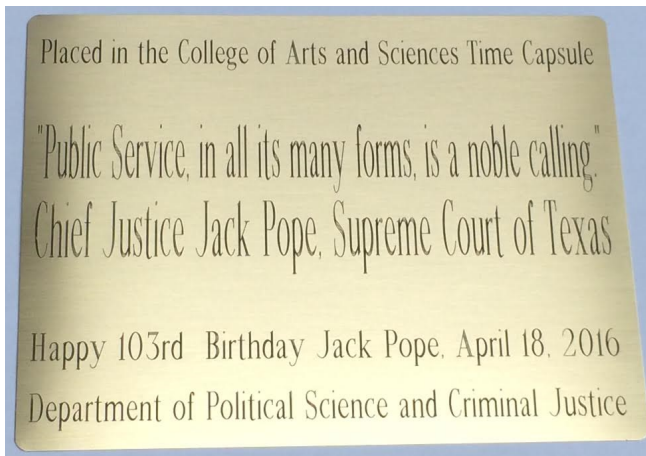


Happy 103rd Birthday to Justice Jack Pope on April 18th !

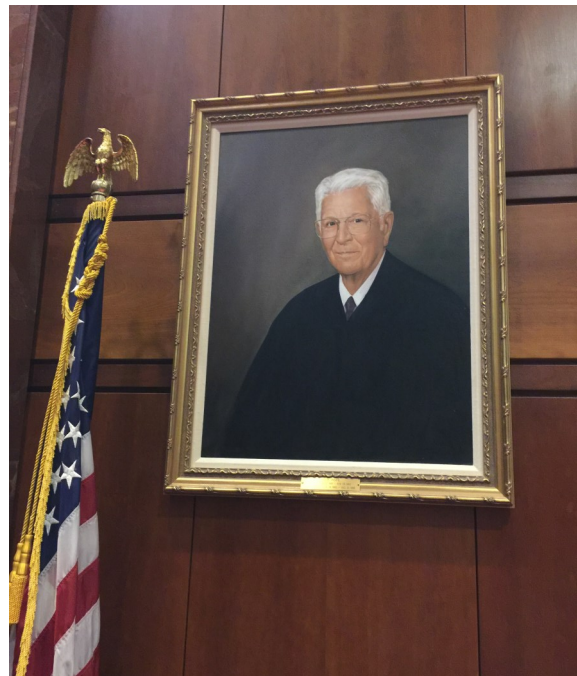

**'94 ACU CJ Alum and Iraq War Veteran
Hired by Texas Tech as Strength and
Conditioning Coach**

Rusty Whitt ('94 CJ) has been hired as the football strength and conditioning coach at Texas Tech.

Whitt served in the U.S. Army from 2003 to 2009 and was deployed to Iraq during Operation Iraqi Freedom V and VI. He was a senior special forces communication sergeant in the 10th Special Forces Group.

In 2013, the website LostLetterman.com named him college football's most intimidating strength coach. He incorporated Special Forces-type drills into conditioning his athletes.

After his bachelor's degree in criminal justice from ACU, Whitt earned a master's in kinesiology from Texas in 1997. He served as a graduate assistant in strength and conditioning at Midwestern State, University of Texas, was in an internship at the U.S. Olympic Training Center, worked as an assistant strength and conditioning coordinator at William & Mary and the University of Louisville before being named head strength and conditioning coach at Sam Houston State University.
