



DR. DAVID DILLMAN WINS FULBRIGHT SCHOLARSHIP

Congratulations to Dr. David Dillman, professor of political science, who was awarded a Fulbright Scholarship during this next academic year. He will be researching and teaching at the University of Belgrade in Serbia.

The Fulbright Program, the most prestigious education program sponsored by the U.S.

Government, is a program of competitive, merit-based grants in over 160 countries designed for educational exchange among students, teachers, professionals, scientists, and artists. The Program was founded by Senator J. William Fulbright in 1946 and aims to increase mutual understanding between the people of the United States and other countries through exchange of persons, knowledge, and skills.

In short, this is the honor of a lifetime for a college professor in the U.S., and we again congratulate Dr. Dillman. There have only been 7 faculty Fulbright awardees from ACU.

Senior Jennie Magner was also awarded a Fulbright this year, winning an English Teaching Assistance grant to serve in the Czech Republic.

After the two Fulbright's were announced in Chapel by ACU Provost Dr. Robert Rhodes on April 18, the Department and the Honors College hosted a reception in the Campus Center Living Room after Chapel.
